# **Another Hudson Great Passes**

The Dixie Chapter, HET has sent out word of the passing of racing great Frank Mundy on the 14th of May.

### From the Dixie Chapter:

"Frank died peacefully at Westminster Commons Home just prior to midnight Thursday. He is survived by his wife Mae, who suffers from advanced dementia. There are no known Funeral plans and no other immediate family members surviving. Our club is sending media packages to the Atlanta paper and major national auto magazines.

Born in Atlanta as Francisco Eduardo Menendez, Frank Mundy turned ninety years old last June. His Hispanic father worked in Atlanta, but died when Frank was quite young. He was sent to an orphanage, and it was there that he learned the strong work ethic and fearlessness which have served him so well. Delivering parcels led to motorcycles, which led to stunt driving. He performed 2,200 shows at the '39 and '40 New York World's Fair. His specialty was the "Slide for Life" in which he was towed at high speeds through fire, wrapped in asbestos – scrub the theory about asbestos shortening your life! As he began his daredevil career he altered his surname to "Mundy" for easier name recognition.

Frank met Bill France at France's Gas Station in Daytona. He and France and others founded NASCAR in 1947. Mundy finished 30th in the first NASCAR race in Char lotte, NC, July 19th 1949. In the second race he came in 3rd at Daytona, FL, and he was rarely "out of the money." After that. He began driving Hudson Hornets regularly in 1953, and won the AAA Grand Championship that year in those cars. In 1955 he switched to the Chrysler 300, sponsored by Kiekhaefer Racing Team with spectacular success. After he retired as a driver in 1956 he worked for Kiekaefer at Mercury Outboard Motors for 17 years. In later years he was an entrepreneur in real estate, among other things. In one bold venture he bought a fledgling boat operation and turned it into the million dollar Custom Craft Boats Co.

The Mundy's have lived in a world of skiing, yachting, and following the Indy car circuits with his friend Roger Penske and the Penske team. The Mundy's car collection until recently included a Lamborghini - a Caddy Eldorado convertible and a Rolls, but he credited the Hudson Hornet and the Chrysler 300 for much of his success."
